The Diversity Section, which is anchored in the Heine Centre for Sustainable Development (HCSD) at Heinrich Heine University Düsseldorf (HHU), informs students, lecturers and staff about events, activities and its own offers in the area of diversity.

When you register - in writing or by e-mail - you have provided personal data to the Diversity Section.

With the following data protection information, we would like to give you an overview of the processing of your personal data and inform you about your rights.

1. Who is responsible for data processing and who can I contact?

2. Which sources and data do we use?

We process personal data that we receive from your application for inclusion in the e-mail distribution list or from your registration for Section qualification and programme offers.

These are: Title, first name, surname, (date of birth), e-mail address, organisation and function.

In the case of the Buddy-Programme “1stGeneration@HHU” and the “Diversity Award”, these are also: street, house number, postcode, city, (degree programme), faculty (and semester).

3. What do we process your data for (purpose of processing) and on what legal basis?

Your data is collected to inform you about the activities of the Diversity Section at HHU, to announce events and training opportunities, to issue certificates and to maintain dialogue with university members. If these purposes need to be extended in the context of projects, we will refer to this separately.

The legal basis for the collection and processing for the above-mentioned purposes is your consent.

4. Who receives my data?

Within HHU, access to your data is granted to those departments that require it for the initiation, implementation and correct processing of your registration, in particular the Centre for Information and Media Technology (ZIM) and the Diversity Section.

No other departments have access to your personal data.

5. How long will my data be stored and passed on?

If necessary, we process and store your personal data for three years. The data that we collect as part of the volunteer project is stored for ten years.

6. What data protection rights do I have?

Every data subject has the right of access (Art. 15 GDPR), the right to be informed (Art. 16 GDPR), the right to erasure (Art. 17 GDPR), the right to restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR), the right to object (Art. 21 GDPR) and the right to data portability (Art. 18 GDPR).

(Art. 21 GDPR) and the right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR). With regard to the right to information and the right to erasure, the restrictions according to §Section 12 Data Protection Act NRW (DSG NRW) and Section 10 DSG NRW.

In addition, there is a right to lodge a complaint with a data protection supervisory authority (Art. 77 GDPR in conjunction with 29 DSG NRW), e.g.

7. Revocation

You can withdraw your consent to the processing of personal data at any time. This also applies to the revocation of declarations of consent given to HHU before the EU General Data Protection Regulation came into force, i.e. before 25 May 2018.

Please note that the revocation is only effective for the future. Processing that took place before the revocation is not affected

8. Is there an obligation for me to provide data?

Your obligation to cooperate arises from your voluntary contact with the Diversity Section of HHU. You can revoke this at any time and your personal data will be deleted.
